Technology Impact Survey

An online survey tool designed for public libraries that want to better understand their communities and how people use their public technology resources and services.

Impact Survey Results:

91.5% of respondents stated that the technology help they received was very helpful.

Of the respondents that visited the library, **55%** used a public computer or wireless network during their visits.

51% of technology users reported that public computing resources are important or very important to themselves personally.

86% of all respondents feel that public computing resources are important or very important to the community.
