



A message from the Director:

This will be my last Report to the Community after serving as Library Director at the Huntington Memorial Library for almost 12 years. It's been an eventful time and, true to the library's mission, I've learned a great deal. I've met wonderful people and worked with a supportive Library Board without whom none of the positive changes would have been possible.

Improving Huntington Park was the top priority after updating the building. With two grants from the Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservations, we have re-imagined the old rotunda into a beautiful overlook terrace. A granite patio surrounded by bluestone boulders were installed - perfect for viewing the iconic hills that surround our city. While we removed many dead trees from the park, we planted even more. The sledding hill was restored and is used by both sledders and bikers.

The second phase of improvements focused on areas adjacent to the library. We built a lovely patio that will host library programs and special events. The Art Plaza is intended to be a focal point for art. Currently, there is a spherical sculpture on loan from a local artist who prefers to remain anonymous. I especially love the Hillside Scramble which offers boulders for children to climb and adults to sit and enjoy the park.

In 2024, after a rigorous selection process, we hired Lothrop Associates to help us develop a design scheme for the building. We asked them to focus on restoring the beauty of this historic home, reconfigure the interior space, and to explore the potential for an addition. They met with the library staff and

Library Trustees to better understand the challenges we face. The next step was gathering community input about how residents use the library and what changes they would like to see. All of this work will result in a playbook for the next Director to guide future building improvements.

We're also embarking on an exciting new venture: a new Children's Library! In 2021, a consultant reviewed our facility and recommended establishing a satellite location due to our space limitations. In 2024 we identified a potential site and surveyed the community - 87% supported the idea. Thanks to that enthusiasm, we're moving forward. I'm thrilled to announce that the Children's Library will be moving to 14 Dietz Street in 2025.
