

EMBRACING THE UNEXPECTED



A message from the Director:

During the second full year of the global pandemic, safety protocols were changed based on risk level. Through it all, the library aimed to provide important services to the public with as little disruption as possible. As 2021 came to a close, the incidence of COVID-19 was at an all-time high.

Reading is still a vital component of library services and adult print fiction was the most popular material getting checked out 22,870 times. The least popular was juvenile print nonfiction with 1,877 books checked out. Downloadable ebooks and audiobooks are on the increase.

Library programs provide enriching, educational activities for the community. They cover a wide range of topics from Book Club and Writers' Group to Minecraft Club and Early Literacy Training. Most were held online or in the park and a lot of our efforts were devoted to developing Take & Make Kits. The Friends of HML helped to fund and package these enriching activity kits. Besides the traditional group programs, library staff also provided One-on-One technology assistance, local history requests, and home delivery.

New to the Children's Area is an Early Literacy Station. Caregivers can pick up materials that support their efforts to foster literacy skills based on five core principles. We also created backpacks based on Storybook Junction themes. People in a hurry can quickly grab a backpack containing books related to one of the stations: Dinosaurs (the most popular), Animals, or Celebrations, etc.

Years of work toward improving the Huntington Park finally became visible as ground was broken in the fall. Funds for this project come from grants from NYS OPRHP, NYS Library Construction Aid, and library funds for a total of \$996,722. In December the good news of another grant from NYS OPRHP for \$500,000 to fund Phase 2 of the Park Project was received. To top it off, the park will provide a special show of daffodils in the spring thanks to the generosity of the Rotary Club.




